# Conservation CSI: how high-tech environmental DNA tools are supporting the conservation of imperiled 'Rhino Rays'


Presented by: Dr. Nicole Phillips from the School of Biological, Environmental, and Earth Sciences at The University of Southern Mississippi

Environmental DNA (eDNA) is a powerful emerging tool to study aquatic species. All aquatic organisms shed DNA into their environments, which can be collected via water samples. High-tech genetic techniques allow us to screen these water samples for eDNA from species of interest, providing critical information on their distributions and ecology. The sensitivity of eDNA approaches makes them cost-effective when compared to traditional survey methodologies, especially for highly threatened species which are often difficult to directly observe. EDNA surveys are proving to be a valuable tool for assessing the distributions and statuses of the imperiled 'Rhino Rays': sawfishes, wedgefishes, giant guitarfishes, guitarfishes, and banjo rays. 'Rhino Rays' have experienced severe global range contractions and are facing a high risk of extinction. We are conducting global eDNA surveys for Rhino Rays to better understand where some of the rarest and most threatened of these species still persist. These data will help define contemporary distributions, ultimately guiding conservation strategies for species on the verge of extinction.

Birds will be moving from their nesting grounds to their wintering areas to find food for all winter. Dauphin Island is known as a "hotspot" due to its' location.
